January 25: Losing A Job and Wrongful Dismissal

It's important to plan for disability or death as it helps those around you carry out your wishes. An enduring power of attorney, a personal directive, and a will are necessary for your plan. In this presentation you'll learn about these basic legal tools and what's involved in acquiring them. You'll also learn about the recent changes brought about by the *Wills and Succession Act*.

February 22: Separation and Divorce

What happens when a couple decides to separate or divorce? This presentation will cover the various legal processes to achieve a separation/divorce and will touch on issues regarding child custody, spousal support and dividing matrimonial property.

This presentation provides an overview of legal aspects of adoption. This discussion will review the adoption process and its necessary rules, as well as, will cover the different types of adoptions including First Nations peoples, international and adult.
