(first in the ***Vish Puri*** series)

The Scarecrow by Michael Connelly
(second in the ***Jack McEvoy*** series)

Jack McEvoy, famed crime reporter for the LA Times, has just discovered that a 16-year-old drug dealer's murder confession is bogus.

Hail to the Chef by Julie Hyzy

(second in the ***White House Chef Mysteries*** series)
White House executive chef Ollie Paras once again finds herself entangled in a murder investigation when an electrician at the White House is "accidentally" killed at work.

The Baker Street Letters by Michael Robertson

(first in the ***Medieval Noir*** series)

Crispin Guest is hired to track down the wayward wife of a wealthy London cloth merchant, and finds himself tangled up in the search for a priceless religious artifact.

The Alexander Cipher by Will Adams

(first in the ***Daniel Knox*** series)

After Egyptologist Daniel Knox stumbles across evidence of the real location of Alexander the Great's tomb, he finds himself on the run from several ruthless people who all want the priceless treasure.

The Last Ember by Daniel Levin

Jonathan Marcus gets caught up in a deadly treasure hunt for the legendary Tabernacle Menorah, a priceless historical artifact that disappeared from Jerusalem more than 2000 years ago.

Turn Coat by Jim Butcher

(eleventh in the ***Dresden Files*** series)

Wizard and private investigator Harry Dresden must track down a traitor working with the wizards' White Council - all to save his old adversary Morgan.

In the Shadow of Gotham by Stefanie Pintoff

(first in the ***Simon Ziele*** series)

New York City police detective Simon Ziele partners with a Columbia law professor and criminologist to find the killer of a brutally murdered graduate student.

Bury Me Deep by Megan Abbott

It's the 1930s. Marion is living the life of a jazz-baby in Phoenix and becomes part of a jealous love triangle. Based on the true story of the Arizona "Trunk Murderess".
